Habitat for Humanity is a global, Christian housing organisation which welcomes people of all faiths and none to help build a world where everyone has a decent place to live.

One in four people in our world live in poor housing. Families are forced to live in places that are cold and damp, overcrowded or do not have a door that locks. Simple homes save lives. Families are healthier, children do better in school and parents have a chance to earn a stable income.

Since 1976 Habitat has helped more than 46 million people to improve their living conditions. Habitat advocates to improve access to affordable shelter and support funding models that enable families with limited resources make vital improvements to their homes.

Habitat is led by local people, who are housing experts in 70 countries, understanding the need and developing innovative ways to respond.

Habitat:

- Supports communities through water and sanitation projects
- Helps disaster affected communities to move from ruin to recovery and works to reduce vulnerabilities and build community resilience.
- Delivers programmes for the most vulnerable eg; leprosy affected families, HIV/Aids, orphans and widows.
- Provides loans for repairs and home improvements
- Helps people to access secure land tenure
- Delivers construction training and education programmes
- Advocates to change housing policies and systems
 which keep people locked in poverty

Across Ireland, more than 30,000 volunteers have joined Habitat locally and globally, engaging in practical projects which break down barriers, build strong communities and help change lives.

In Ireland, Habitat directly tackles poverty through its network of Habitat ReStores which provide access to low-cost home improvement materials, employability training for people of all abilities and diverts tons of material from landfill. Habitat also raises funds to support long-term partner programmes in some of our world's poorest communities. You get far more return on this investment than any other team building event. This is real – real problems, real solutions with real differences made.

The work

No construction experience is needed, as all sites are supervised and full training is provided by the local Habitat construction staff.

Budget

Average budget per person of $\pounds/\pounds2,000-2,500$ which includes flights, accommodation, travel insurance, airport transfers, in country travel, meals, on-site refreshments, team t-shirts, safety equipment, training/supervision and a donation towards Habitat's work.
